APA Placement Service

All job candidates seeking academic positions in the field of classics should register in the fall with the Placement Service sponsored by the American Philological Association and the AIA.

The Placement Service: sends registered job-seekers regular lists of advertisements for job openings; makes available to hiring institutions a book of curricula vitae of registered job-seekers; and schedules interviews between hiring institutions and job candidates at the annual joint meeting of the AIA and APA.
