



Summer Field Programs in Archaeology

June and July 2011

Join staff archaeologists from June 13 to July 15 as they return to the Heckleman site, a prehistoric Native American settlement located near Milan in Erie County, Ohio. The field school provides a comprehensive introduction to archaeological field work. Students are instructed in the methods of archaeological survey, techniques of hand excavation, artifact identification, and the preparation of field notes and documentation. This field opportunity is offered in two formats to serve both college students and interested nonprofessionals. The non-credit option is called the Archaeology in Action Program in which Museum members sign up for one to five weeks of field experience. The cost of this program is \$200.00 per week; transportation to and from the site and lodging are the responsibility of each participant. A Museum membership is required for participation at an additional cost (\$55 individual membership). The second option is the field school course, **Anthropology 324: Field Methods in Archaeology**, which is offered for three to five credits (three to five weeks) through Case Western Reserve University or through Hiram College. Transportation and room and board arrangements are the responsibility of each student. We also offer a paid internship opportunity for Ohio undergraduate or graduate students with some field experience. This internship is sponsored by the Cleveland Archaeological Society and involves five weeks with the Archaeology field school followed by three weeks of experience in the Archaeology laboratory of the Cleveland Museum of Natural History.
