

# Flinders Archaeology Field Schools and Intensives 2017

The Department of Archaeology at Flinders University regularly offers a range of field schools and other intensive topics in locations around Australia.

## **ARCH8152/ARCH3309 Maritime Archaeology Field School**

Phillip Island, Victoria, Australia – January 27 to 12 February

The maritime archaeology field school will include a shipwreck survey of McHaffie Reef plus a study of a land-based survey of maritime infrastructure and coastal and maritime sites of various ages and types.

## **ARCH8017 Cultural Heritage and the Law Intensive**

Adelaide, South Australia – 6 to 10 February

Taught by renowned Adelaide Barrister Andrew Collett, Indigenous lawyer Leanne Liddle and archaeologist/anthropologist Associate Professor Amy Roberts, this topic will critically examine the role of the law in shaping notions of Aboriginal cultural heritage.

## **ARCH8806 Historical Archaeology Field School**

Willow Court Asylum New Norfolk, Tasmania, Australia – 7 to 13 February

On this field school you will excavate key portions of the site to uncover patient treatment, living and working conditions, health, diet, rules and regulations. Other elements include collecting former staff oral histories, recording ghost stories and trying to understand the community's relationship to the place and its past.

## **ARCH8804 Ethnoarchaeology Field School**

Port Lincoln, South Australia – 10 to 14 April

Learn how to undertake ethical and culturally sensitive ethnoarchaeological research with Aboriginal communities. Activities may include site recording, artefact recording, and collecting oral histories.

## **ARCH8802 Conservation Practicum**

Adelaide, South Australia – 18 to 29 September

This topic is taught in intensive mode over one week and necessitates involvement and input from a range of maritime practitioners. SCUBA diving qualifications are NOT necessary for participation. The body of the topic will comprise lectures, a practical exercise and a tutorial.

## **ARCH8808 Introductory Archaeological Geophysics**

Adelaide, South Australia – 18 to 29 September

This topic teaches the scientific principles behind a range of techniques used in archaeological prospection including basic field operations, data processing, data interpretation and geophysical reporting.

## **ARCH8408 Human Osteology Intensive**

Adelaide, South Australia – 30 October to 3 November

An intensive lab topic providing students with a detailed introduction to the human skeleton. Students will learn how to identify the components of the skeleton and the range of biological and chemical information that is recorded in the human skeleton. Workshops provide the essential hands-on practical component of teaching and learning in human osteology.
