Learn state of the art archaeological excavation methods as we study Western Stemmed Tradition components held in the Cooper's Ferry site, located in western Idaho's beautiful lower Salmon River canyon. Students earn undergraduate or graduate level credits (9-12 cr) by enrolling in ANTH 438/538.
