

# 2020 Field School

Excavate in Beautiful Black Mesa, Oklahoma Panhandle

May 31 – June 27, 2020



Join us as we investigate three sites in scenic No Man's Land, Oklahoma Panhandle. The first is a small rock shelter (pictured above) overlooking the Cimarron River. Second is a tipi ring site located on a mesa overlooking a spring. And third is a possible Folsom Paleoindian camp located along a small spring-fed stream. You will learn excavation techniques, including how to set up a grid, mapping, and profiling. In addition you will learn survey techniques, including how to identify and document sites. Special activities include flint knapping, atlatl dart throwing, animal bone identification, and more. We will visit rock art sites, lithic quarries, and climb Black Mesa.
