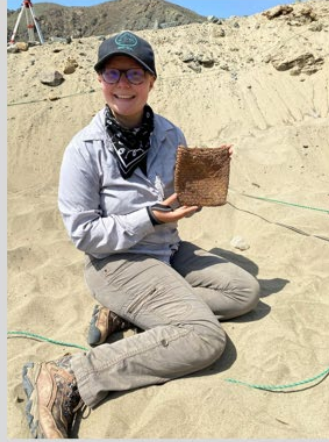

Overview

El Campanario Archaeological Project is a long-term research project that offers graduate, undergraduate, and participants hands-on experience conducting archaeological excavation, artifact identification, and human remains analysis. The focus of this research is to understand the socio-political organization of the El Campanario site during the Late Intermediate Period (A.D. 1000-1400). The research project started in 2015 with the excavation of domestic structures where production activities (ceramic and textiles) were conducted. Later, archaeological excavations included the adobe (mud-brick) platform and the pre-Hispanic cemetery.



El Campanario Project 2026

El Campanario project for the summer of 2026 will be organized in two separate sessions. The bioarchaeology session (June 8th to July 10th) will continue excavating at the pre-Hispanic cemetery of Cuzcuz, where previous excavations identified burial contexts. The archaeology session (July 13th to August 14th) will continue the excavation of Platform 1, a mud-brick structure containing painted walls and plastered floors where the local elite conducted public events.

Bioarchaeology Session (June 8th – July 10th)

The bioarchaeology session will consist of excavating the pre-Hispanic cemetery at the site of CuzCuz. Previous excavations at this site uncovered burial contexts containing various types of artifacts, such as ceramics and textiles. Students will learn excavation methods, mapping of burial contexts, recording of artifacts, identification of human remains, ceramic analysis, paleopathology, and estimations of sex, stature, and age.



Archaeology Session (July 13th – August 14th)

The archaeology session will consist of the excavation of Platform 1 at the site of El Campanario. Platform 1 is a mud brick structure containing plastered walls and patios. Previous excavations at the site uncovered corridors and enclosures along with ceramics, wooden objects, and textiles. Students will learn excavation methods, mapping, recording of artifacts, material analysis (ceramic and textiles), osteology, and curation of artifacts.



Program cost: 2800 US dollars (5 weeks)

Include:

- Transportation from the airport to the hotel (arrival and departure)
- One hotel night in Lima on arrival and departure.
- Transportation Lima-Huarmey at the beginning and end of the project.
- Individual room with bathroom in Huarmey
- Three meals a day (Monday – Saturday)
- Field trips (Caral, Panamarca, Cerro Sechín)
