Hadrian's Villa near Tivoli is a monumental living (garden city) complex built by Emperor Hadrian from 117DC as an imperial palace, near the city of Rome. This villa is considered the epitome in architecture of the opulence and elegance of the Roman world. In 1999 was appointed one of the Human Heritage Monuments by Unesco, proclaimed a masterpiece that uniquely brings together the highest expressions of the material cultures of the Mediterranean world. It is the most extensive ancient roman villa, covering approximately 7 square miles, more or less as Pompeii.





Its buildings were designed to follow the natural lay of the land and included baths and bath buildings, libraries, sculpture gardens, theatres, alfresco dining halls, pavilions, and private suites. Construction began on top of the foundation of a pre-existing villa that belonged to his wife Vibia Sabina. The Villa could be reached by the ancient via Tiburtina and via Prenestina. The area was chosen for its abundant waters and aqueducts that passed through to Rome, like Anio Vetus, Anio Nobus, Aqua Marcia and Aqua Claudia.
