





Tunisia: Phoenicians to Romans, Mosaics to Mosques April 11-23, 2024 (13 days | 16 guests) with archaeologist Nejib ben Lazreg

Visit seven of Tunisia's UNESCO World Heritage Sites, including fabled Carthage, Dougga, Kairouan, and El Djem. Other highlights include Bulla Regia's underground Roman villas, the Roman city of Sbeitla (Sufetula), Thuburbo Majus's sunken winter baths, and the newly re-opened Bardo Museum with its renowned mosaics.

Türkiye: Ancient Splendors of the Aegean & Mediterranean April 14-27, 2024 (14 days | 16 guests) with archaeologist Yasar Ersoy

Learn about many of the world's most magnificent Greco-Roman temples, theaters, and stadiums, visiting Ephesus, Priene, Miletus, Didyma, Aphrodisias, Sagalassos, Perge, and Aspendos. Three full days in Istanbul include all of the major highlights. An optional post-tour extension features the Neolithic settlement of Çatalhöyük, the Hittite capital of Hattusa, and the Cappadocia region.

Decorated Caves of the Pyrenees & the Rhone Valley

April 18-29, 2024 (12 days | 16 guests) with paleoanthropologist Ian Tattersall

Discover many unheralded examples of Ice Age art in Spain and France. Highlights include the original decorated caves of Isturitz and Oxocelhaya, Niaux, and Gargas. Also visit the spectacular Chauvet cave replica and recently-opened Cosquer Cave replica, referred to as an "underwater Lascaux." Enjoy fine food and delightful accommodations.

Morocco: From the Desert to the Sea

April 20 - May 4, 2024 (15 days | 12 guests) with cultural anthropologist/architectural historian Trevor Marchand

See the archaeology, architecture, art, and history of Morocco, visiting the best-known historic sites, including six UNESCO World Heritage Sites, the ruins of medieval Sijilmassa and Aghmat, as well as bustling casbahs, medinas, and souks. Visit all four Imperial Cities, archaeological monuments, fabulous museums, natural landscapes, an ancient oasis, and idyllic rural settlements.

From Stonehenge to Carnac: Megaliths, Monuments & Tombs


May 28 - June 8, 2024 (12 days | 14 guests) with archaeologist Peter Bogucki

Hiking Scotland's Orkney & Shetland Islands

July 29 - August 8, 2024 (11 days | 15 guests) with archaeologist Val Turner

Explore Scotland's Northern Isles: prehistoric stone circles, burial chambers, and settlements; quaint villages; huge seabird colonies; and remarkable plant life—all amidst dramatic landscapes. This will be Scotland seen slowly, with time for in-depth exploration at each site. The Orkney and Shetland islands have an amazing wealth of archaeological sites dating back 5,000 years.

Ireland's Southern Coast

September 3-16, 2024 (14 days | 12 guests) with geoarchaeologist Stephen Mandal

Admire dramatic seascapes and sites from earliest prehistory to the Iron Age (Celtic Period), through early Christian sites to the medieval period. Start out in Dublin and then drive to the southern coast, stopping in Wexford, Cork, Baltimore, and Killarney. Highlights include The Irish National Heritage Park, Hook Peninsula, Tintern Abbey, Ardmore, Drombeg Stone Circle, Sherkin Island, Ring of Kerry, and Rock of Cashel.

Join this journey where history, nature, science, and culture converge. Sicily: Archaeology, Art & Cuisine October 12-24, 2024 (13 days | 16 guests) with archaeologist Jenifer Neils

Join us and learn about many of the most impressive archaeological monuments in the Mediterranean, such as Agrigento, Selinunte, Segesta, and Syracuse. Admire the landscapes, and see two of the finest examples of Norman architecture: Monreale Cathedral and the Royal Palace of Palermo. An optional post-tour extension to Malta is available.

Life, Luxury & Leisure in Ancient Rome

October 13-24, 2024 (12 days | 16 guests) with archaeologist Crispin Corrado

Immerse yourself in the grandeur of ancient Rome while uncovering secrets of its daily life, traveling from Rome to Naples and Sorrento. Visit Rome's House of Augustus, Baths of Caracalla, Pantheon, and more. Marvel at opulent Hadrian's Villa in Tivoli and at the fascinating ruins of Pompeii and Herculaneum. See the submerged ruins of the coastal resort of Baiae on a boat excursion, Cuma Archaeological Park with its Cave of the Sibyl, and Paestum's magnificent Greek temples.

Japan: Ancient & Medieval Treasures & Temples

Explore collections of ancient artifacts, exquisite lacquerware, and kimonos.

Travel to the world of the ancient Etruscans. Visit their necropolises, whose tombs feature brightly-painted scenes of feasting and dancing, including Cerveteri, Tarquinia, and Sovana; the important Etruscan towns of Veii, Fiesole, Volterra, Orvieto, and Vulci; many museums with unparalleled Etruscan collections, including Rome's Villa Giulia and Vatican City's Etruscan Gregorian Museum; and more.

Origins of Humans & Wine: Azerbaijan, Georgia & Armenia

October 14-29, 2024 (16 days | 14 guests) with paleoanthropologist Ian Tattersall

Ancient history of the Caucasus region awaits you, where *Homo* skulls were found at Dmanisi and wine-making goes back 8,000 years. UNESCO World Heritage Sites include Baku, Azerbaijan's Old Town and Gobustan's petroglyphs; Mtskheta, in Georgia; and Armenia's Echmiadzin and Zvartnots Cathedral. Sample wines and visit the cave complex of Areni-1.



Kenya & Tanzania: Wildlife & Human Origins in East Africa January 7-21, 2025 (15 days | 16 guests) with paleoanthropologist William Harcourt-Smith

Visit Olduvai Gorge, where the Leakeys' famous discoveries indicated that hominins had evolved in Africa; view wildlife in Ngorongoro Crater and four national parks; and ponder how early humans survived and thrived in this natural environment.



This tropical adventure takes you to ancient Maya sites in the jungles of Mexico, Guatemala, and Honduras. Maya art and architecture will "come alive" as you encounter enormous stelae (carved monoliths), painted frescoes, stucco friezes, carved lintels, and temple-pyramids. Explore, in-depth, the sites of Palenque, Bonampak, Yaxchilán, Tikal, Copán, and Quiriguá.
