

Nancy Wilkie is a distinguished archaeologist and professor who has lectured to acclaim on numerous educational tours and cruises throughout the Mediterranean. From 1998-2002 she served

as President of the AIA, and in 2009-10 she was the AIA's Charles Eliot Norton lecturer, one of the highest honors that the Institute bestows. She is William H. Laird Professor of Classics, Anthropology, and the Liberal Arts, Emerita, at Carleton College (Northfield, MN), where she was co-coordinator of the Archaeology Concentration. Carleton College is a cosponsor of this program for whose travelers Nancy will also serve as representative. Nancy has worked on archaeological projects in Greece, Egypt, and Nepal, authored more than 30 articles, and coedited three books on archaeology. In April 2003 the President appointed Nancy to the Cultural Property Advisory Committee of the U.S. State Department, on which she continues to serve. In April 2013 she was elected President of the U.S. Committee of the Blue Shield, an organization dedicated to the protection of cultural property in times of armed conflict.

Discover ancient sites, medieval towns, and quaint villages on this four-night land tour and eight-night cruise. Begin with a two-night hotel stay in Athens and explore the world-famous Acropolis and the Acropolis Museum. Visit the Byzantine monastery of Hosios Loukas, followed by Delphi, on the slopes of Mount Parnassus, home of the ancient Oracle of Apollo. 

AIRFARE: Roundtrip airfare ticketed by Voyages to Antiquity's (VTA's) air department is economy class and includes transfers. See "The Complete Air/Land/Cruise Package" column on the next page for airfare "add-on" options. Participants booking flights and transfers on their own will receive a \$1,000 credit, per person, to be applied on the final invoice. All government and airline fees and taxes are included. A confirmed flight itinerary can be provided within 60 days of deposit for most departures. Some non-standard gateways may incur additional charges. Airline-imposed personal charges such as baggage fees may apply. The air itinerary is subject to change and is not considered final until VTA has issued the airline ticket. You may not be able to change your confirmed flight arrangements without an additional fee. Contact us for information regarding all available gateway cities.

PAYMENTS: A deposit of 10% of fare per person is required to reserve your space on the tour and is payable by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or check made payable to "EOS-Passenger Account-AIA VTA9/19." Final payment is due 90 days prior to departure and must be by personal check only; credit cards are not accepted for final payment. By submitting your deposit you are bound by the terms and conditions delineated throughout this brochure or elsewhere published.

Suite, Stateroom & Cabin Descriptions

All suites, staterooms, and cabins have a bath and/or shower, flatscreen TV, safe, hair dryer, and are fully air-conditioned. Balcony Class staterooms (categories A to D) have additional amenities as detailed on the next page. The sizes, layouts, and bed configurations will vary within a category.

The areas indicated are averages and include the balcony. Beds may be fixed double (queen size), fixed separate twin beds, or twin beds that can be converted into double beds. All outside staterooms/cabins have windows except Category J, most of which have portholes. Single cabin features include European full size beds – cabin sizes are smaller than sizes noted for double occupancy cabins.

Category A: *Owner's Suites:* 550 sq ft staterooms located on Lido Deck. Marble bathrooms, dressing area, separate sitting area, and private balcony. Convertible twin beds.

Category B: *Junior Balcony Suites*: 310 sq ft staterooms located on Lido Deck. Marble bathrooms, walk-in closet, sitting area, and private balcony. Convertible twin beds.

Category C/D: *Deluxe Balcony Staterooms:* 250-275 sq ft staterooms located on Lido, Bridge, and Belvedere Decks. Bath/shower or walk-in shower, sitting area, and private balcony. Fixed double bed, separate twins, or convertible twins depending on cabin selected. Cabins 807 and 808 on Lido Deck are smaller and do not have a sitting area.

Category E: *Deluxe Staterooms:* 215 sq ft staterooms located on Belvedere Deck. Private bath/shower or walk-in shower. Convertible twin beds. Cabins 556 and 563 are smaller but have a fixed double bed and a balcony.

Category F: *Deluxe Staterooms:* 170-200 sq ft staterooms located on Lido, Bridge, and Belvedere Decks. Bath/shower or walk-in shower. Convertible twin or fixed double beds.

Category G: *Premium Outside Cabins:* 130-150 sq ft staterooms located on Bridge and Lido Decks. Private shower, fixed twin beds, convertible twin beds, or fixed double bed. Views in some cabins are partially obstructed by lifeboats.

Category H: *Premium Outside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Belvedere and Columbus Decks. Fixed twin beds with private shower.

Category I: *Premium Outside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins on Bridge Deck have two windows with views partially obstructed by lifeboats and some cabins feature a fixed double bed.

Category J: *Standard Outside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Columbus Deck. Fixed twin beds with private shower. These cabins are similar in size and layout to Category I, but most have portholes in place of windows.

Category K/L: *Premium Inside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Belvedere and Columbus Decks. Fixed twin beds with private shower.

Category M: *Standard Inside Cabins:* 130 sq ft cabins located on Belvedere and Columbus Decks. Fixed twin beds with private shower.

What to Expect

Choose a single land/voyage program (14 days each) OR combine them for a grand, 20-day voyage! Cruise aboard the 216-cabin Aegean Odyssey, and stay in 4-star hotels on the land portions of the individual programs. Daily excursions feature extensive sightseeing and require a certain level of fitness and mobility. A minimum expected level of fitness would be the ability to walk one to two miles within a period of two to three hours; ascend and/or descend multiple flights of stairs without assistance; and walk easily and comfortably along uneven, slightly hilly, and/or unstable surfaces. Also, some ports on the cruise itineraries may require transport to/from land via the ship's or local tenders, so you must be able to step down 1' or 2' into or out of boats, or onto floating platforms or piers. All participants are expected to be physically active and not be an impediment to others on excursions, to enjoy traveling as part of a group, and to be ready to experience cultural differences. Anyone who is not able to walk unassisted for extended periods is kindly advised not to join. If you have any questions about your ability to participate, we suggest that you visit your personal physician with this brochure in hand, and discuss whether or not the program is appropriate for you. In this region, at this time of year, average daily temperatures tend to range from the low 50s to the low 80s (F). Aboard the Aegean Odyssey there is internet service on Belvedere Deck and Wifi is available in designated areas; charges may apply. Complete pre-departure details, such as what to pack and more of what to expect, will be sent to participants.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS, RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND BINDING ARBITRATION AGREEMENT

RESPONSIBILITY: Eos Study Tours, Archaeological Institute of America, and its and their employees, shareholders, subsidiaries, affiliates, officers, directors or trustees, successors and assigns (collectively "Sponsor"), do not own or operate any entity which is to or does provide goods or services for your trip including, for example, lodging facilities; airline, vessel, or other transportation companies; guides or guide services; local ground operators; providers or organizers of optional excursions; food service or entertainment providers; etc. All such persons and entities are independent contractors. As a result, Sponsor is not liable for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any such person or of any other third party. In addition and without limitation, Sponsor is not responsible for any injury, loss, death, inconvenience, delay, or damage to person or property in connection with the provision of any goods or services whether resulting from, but not limited to, acts of force majeure; acts of God; acts of government; acts of war or civil unrest, insurrection or revolt; bites from or attacks by animals, insects, or pests; strikes or other labor activities; criminal or terrorist activities of any kind or the threat thereof; sickness, illness, epidemics or the threat thereof; the lack of availability of or access to medical attention or the quality thereof; overbooking or downgrading of accommodations; mechanical or other failure of airplanes, vessels, or other means of transportation; or for any failure of any transportation mechanism to arrive or depart timely or safely. In addition, Sponsor is not liable for its own negligence, and participant assumes all risk thereof. CHANGES IN ITINERARY OR FEATURES: Sponsor reserves the right to change the itinerary or trip features at any time and for any reason, with or without notice, and Sponsor shall not be liable for any loss of any kind as a result of any such changes. Sponsor may cancel a trip (or an option) for any reason whatsoever; if so, its sole responsibility is to refund monies paid by the participant. Sponsor is not required to cancel any trip for any reason including, without limitation, United States Department of State, World Health Organization, or other Warnings or Advisories of any kind. Sponsor is not responsible for penalties assessed by air carriers resulting from operational and/or itinerary changes, even if Sponsor makes the flight arrangements or cancels the trip. Sponsor reserves the right to substitute hotels or attractions of a similar category for those listed in this brochure. LUGGAGE: Luggage allowance policies are set by the airlines and may change without prior notice. PHYSICAL ACCESSIBILITY: All programs require physical independence and mobility. Any physical or mental condition that may require special medical attention or physical assistance (for example, the need of a wheelchair) must be reported in writing when you make your reservation. Participants requiring assistance must travel with a companion who will assist them throughout and will be responsible for handling equipment. Participants must be able to embark or disembark motor coaches alone or with minimal assistance from their traveling companion, and climb stairs and step over raised thresholds without assistance. <u>REFUNDS</u>: Prices quoted are based on group participation. No refunds will be made for any part of the program in which participants choose not to participate. Refunds cannot be made to participants who do not complete the tour for any reason, nor to participants whose entry into any country on the itinerary is delayed or denied. TRIP INSURANCE: Sponsor strongly recommends that participants purchase trip cancellation insurance. In the event that you must cancel your participation, trip cancellation insurance may be the only source of reimbursement. Trip cancellation insurance is available through Sponsor and others and covers certain expenses in conjunction with cancellation due to illness or accident and damaged or lost luggage. Sponsor will send participants an application upon receipt of their reservation. RATES: Prices quoted are based on fares in effect at the time of printing and are subject to changes at any time. On all programs, even after full payment, Sponsor reserves the right to increase the tour price in the event of cost increases due to changes in supplier costs, tax increases, currency fluctuations or fuel and energy surcharges, and all such increases are to be paid to Sponsor upon notice to the participant of such increases. FORUM AND METHODOLOGY FOR DISPUTE RESOLUTION: Any dispute or claim which refers or relates to this contract, any literature related to the trip, or the trip itself shall be litigated solely and exclusively in and for courts in Keene, New Hampshire, subject to substantive and procedural New Hampshire law, and for this limited purpose, the parties agree to exclusive venue and personal jurisdiction therein. At the participant's option, however, in lieu of litigation, Sponsor will agree to binding arbitration in Keene, New Hampshire, subject to substantive, but not procedural, New Hampshire law, pursuant to the then existing commercial rules of the American Arbitration Association. In any such arbitration, the arbitrator, and not any federal, state, or local court or agency, shall have exclusive authority to resolve any dispute relating to the interpretation, applicability, enforceability, conscionability, or formation of this contract, including but not limited to any claim that all or any part of this contract is void or voidable. <u>CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS</u>: Sponsor reserves the right to cancel this tour prior to departure, in which case payment will be refunded without further obligation on our part. However, if trip cancellation, itinerary changes, and/or delays are mandated by causes beyond our control, the participant shall have the option of accepting in lieu of the original tour such rescheduled tour or other substituted tour(s) as may be offered by Sponsor, or else, receiving a refund of as much of such advance tour expenditures as Sponsor is able to recover on the participant's behalf from carriers, third-party tour vendors, etc. Sponsor, however, shall not have any obligation or liability to the participant beyond the foregoing. Baggage is entirely at owner's risk. Sponsor reserves the right to decline to accept or retain any participant at any time. The right is reserved to decline to accept as a participant, or remove from a trip, without refund, any person it judges to be incapable of meeting the rigors and requirements of participating in the activities, or who is abusive to other trip participants, leaders, or third parties, or who is determined to detract from the enjoyment of the trip by others.
