Rofalco - Vulci 2019 Summer field school

Archaeological site: Rofalco. In the suggestive "forest of the Lamone", which lies between the medieval villages of Farnese (Lazio) and Pitigliano (Tuscany).

Chronology: Etruscan period, IV - III century B.C.

Description: Rofalco was an Etruscan fortress that controlled the northern part of the territory of Vulci and the road to Lake Bolsena. It was destroyed by the Roman army around 280 BC. Starting in 1996, excavations have brounght to light the massive defensive walls, with square towers and an exceptional paved door, streets, houses, warehouses and cisterns. The abundance of pottery and tools found clearly demonstrate Rofalco's major role as centre of collection for all the manufactured products from the area, as well as its military function.









Partecipants: The camp hosts 20-30 university students and volunteers. No previous experience is required. A certificate of partecipation valid for university credits will be released.

The operations involving such activities are addressed to students professionals of the archaeological and cultural heritage fields.

Programme: This year, activities will focus outside the central part of the settlement, not far from the monumental door, where in the last years there have been interesting findings of residential buildings.

The excavation areas will be enlarged, in order to better understand the topography of this part of the settlement and the function of some buildings. Students and volunteers will also partecipate actively in restoration laboratory, workshops and guided tours.

Partecipants will take part in outreach and promotion projects of the site which includes conferences, guided visits, partecipation in territorial events in order to promote the activities and the site itself.



Description of the Site

Rofalco is located within the dense and charming forest of the Natural Park "Selva del Lamone", near the medieval towns of Pitigliano and Farnese, in Italy, located between Tuscany and Lazio.

Rofalco was an Etruscan fortress in the northern part of Vulci's territory; it was destroyed by the Romans around 280 BCE.
Since 1996, the excavation revealed a massive defensive wall with squared towers and an impressive paved gate dominated by a massive lookout bastion.

Inside the fortress archaeologists discovered roads, open areas and several well preserved buildings: houses, barracks, warehouses,



The site was a strategic hub with a military function but also a collection center for the agricultural products of the area. The numerous pottery and tools found so far clearly show the site's importance as well as the aristocratic nature of its rulers.

Rofalco is the first example of fortified site to be systematically excavated in the area, and is a perfect opportunity to study the transition between the Etruscan and Roman worlds. Artefacts from the site make up the core of the Etruscan section of the Museum of Farnese.









The Program

This year we will investigate several wooded areas within the defensive wall. The activities will be concentrated in the central part of the settlmenet, not farm from the Main Gate, where structure of different type have been found: a large cistern for water and some rooms with a residential character. the audioquides, visiting tour The excavation areas will be enlarged, in order to better understand the topographical disposition of this part of the fortress, as well as the funcion of some utilitarian buildings.

Each participant will gain practical skills ands-on experience while participating in real research activities. The core of the School is the site excavation and documentation; in addition, during the two weeks, students and



volunteers will take part in different laboratory activities on Etruscan pottery analysis and restoration techniques. Other labs will be devoted to GIS and 3D documentation. Further activities consist of designing and executing panels, signs, routes, and models of the site. During the Summer Field School, seminars and visits to local archaeological sites and museums will be organized.

Following past tradition, on Friday there will be a public conference to illustrate the results of the season; while Saturday will be devoted to provide free guided tours to tourists and visitors.

In order to promote our activities (and enjoy the local traditions!), during the four weeks we will go to several festivals and events in Lazio and Tuscany.

On Saturday or Sunday, there will be a tour to one of the major archaeological sites or museums and a half-day to relax at the lake or beach. The final night of Saturday there will be a barbeque feast.

All the activities are carried out in collaboration with the National Achaeological Bureau, the Natural Park and the local administrations.

Program activities are subject to change.






The Summer Field School is located just at the border between Tuscany and Lazio, north of Rome, at the center of the territory of the Etruscan city of Vulci. Over a thousand archaeological sites have been identified in this landscape, through a variety of surveys and

excavations. A project directed by researchers from Roman Archaeological Association and University at Buffalo SUNY will bring this information together with environmental and topographic data and aerial imagery, to help in a new study of the territory. The project was

awarded a SPARC-NSF grant to develop a webGIS aiming to better understand the military and economic organization of the pre-Roman landscape, the Etruscan response to Roman invasion and the Roman changes after the conquest of Vulci.

Participants

The Field School usually hosts about 30 graduate, undergraduate and volunteers from all over the world. No previous excavation experience is required. We provide a certificate of participation valid for <u>credits</u>.



Housing & Transportation

The participants will be hosted at the GAR Center 'Mulino Bocci', via G. Marconi 64, Ischia di Castro (Viterbo). Breakfast, most of the dinners and some of the laboratory activities, will be held at the 'Mulino'.

The accommodation consists of dormitory rooms with 6-8 beds, shared toilets and showers. Participant will have use of a small refrigerator. There are facilities for hand washing clothes at the school.

Following the volunteer spirit of the Field School, each participant in turn will help in preparing and serving the meals and keeping everything in order.

Costs

Travel to, from and within Italy (including to arrive at the School) is at the participant expense. Participants are expected to arrive at Ischia di Castro (or at the train station of Montalto di Castro). Please contact etruschi.lamone@gmail.com for precise directions.

The cost for two weeks is €365, for one week is €250. On top of this, you will pay the Gar annual membership fee (€24 for under 30 and €37 for everyone else), which is necessary to recive insurance cover during the dig. Accomodation, subsistance and transport during the camp are included in the feed. Special events (i.e. restaurant, parties, activities outside the program) and spending money are not included.

In order to participate students must accept and follow the School rule, as well as sign some waiver froms upon arrival (some of the waivers are included in the application form at the end of this booklet).

Required Equipment

Participants need to provide their own personal medication.

In order to participate in the field activities participants must wear confortable long pants (not shorts!). Participants should ensure that they are able to cover their arms, therefore long sleeved shirts are recommended. Furthermore, participants have to bring with them the following items:
