CYA LIBRARY

The CYA Library serves as a learning resource center, offering print and electronic collections to help students develop academically and professionally. Textbooks and other course materials are issued on loan from the Library throughout the semester. Students also have access to the Blegen Library of the American School of Classical Studies at Athens (ASCSA), one of the most important libraries in Athens.

Our assistive technologies enhance accessibility and inclusivity for our students. The librarian can produce large prints, has text to speech software and provides access to the note taking software Genio. The technology emphasizes CYA's commitment to ensuring all students have equal access to educational resources and opportunities.

LIVING IN Athens

Apartment Living

Residential apartments are available in the Pangrati neighborhood of Athens. All apartments are a short walk (2 to 10 minutes) from the Academic Center.

The advantage of these accommodations over typical student dormitories is that you will have more opportunity to interact with your Greek neighbors and generally live like Athenians do.



Homestay Experience

Homestay is not simply an alternative to our CYA apartments; it is an enrichment of the study abroad experience, an immersion in Greek culture and the Greek family lifestyle, and an opportunity to develop life-long relationships and a second home halfway across the world.

Each semester, CYA matches students who have indicated an interest in the program with a host family with complementary interests, lifestyles, or hobbies. Homestay accommodations depend on availability and on student profiles.



FUNDING YOUR CYA Experience

Finances should not be a barrier to experience study abroad. CYA aims to help our students find as many options as possible for financial assistance.

Academic Year | Semester

CYA scholarships are need based and awards range in amounts up to half the cost of a semester's tuition.

CYA students accepted for a semester/year are eligible to apply.

Summer

Need based funding up to \$2,000 is available for our summer programs. Ask about our summer scholarship application.

Our ANSWERS

What are the application deadlines?

CYA employs a rolling admissions policy for semester applications. Since applications will be considered only as long as space is available, CYA encourages early application. We recommend consulting with your study abroad office to adhere to their deadlines. For CYA Summer programs, priority deadline is April 1.

Will my school accept credit from CYA?

Most colleges and universities accept CYA courses for transfer credit. Students are responsible for arranging academic credit with their college or university and must have the Statement of Study Abroad Approval/Credit Transfer form completed by the study abroad advisor or dean.

How about the fees?

We recommend prospective students check with their study abroad office for complete information on study abroad costs. To help you make a financial plan, a comprehensive breakdown of fees and an estimated budget is available on the CYA website.

Can I use my financial aid from home when studying abroad with CYA?

For help with transferring your financial aid package, please reach out to your Study Abroad Advisor or Financial Aid Officer on campus. They can also assist you in finding additional sources of financial aid or loans.
