Dear traveler,

This summer, join a team of lecturers on a voyage that will explore one of the Arctic's most interesting and magnificent areas, Norway's Svalbard (Spitsbergen). Enjoy the comforts of a luxurious expedition ship while exploring a remote region far from tourist routes.

A group of islands located between Norway and the North Pole, Svalbard is a place of vast glaciers, calving icebergs, snowcapped mountains, and majestic serene fjords. Two-thirds of the archipelago is covered by nature reserves created to protect the environment and the remarkable wildlife of the islands. Covered by ice for most of the year, the short Arctic summer that provides 24-hour days reveals the grandeur and natural life of Svalbard. The fish-rich sea that surrounds the islands attracts large numbers of birds, including kittiwakes, Arctic terns, fulmars, puffins, and black and Brunnich's guillemots. Whales, seals, and walrus frequent the area, while the tundra supports a surprising number of flowering plants.

But the undoubted king of this high Arctic archipelago is the polar bear. Svalbard is one of the best places on Earth to observe polar bears in their natural habitat. Estimated to number about 3,000, polar bears outnumber the human population of the islands.

Starting in Oslo, Norway's lovely capital, we will fly to Tromso, located above the Arctic Circle, where we will embark our ship, and cruise across the Barents Sea to Bear Island, a nature reserve and home to thousands of birds. From Bear Island, it's just an overnight cruise to the Svalbard archipelago, where we will spend seven days exploring this extraordinary group of islands and search for its wildlife, especially polar bears. Our Arctic Odyssey will end in Tromso, from where we will fly home.


Our home for this Arctic adventure will be SH *Minerva*, a state-of-the-art expedition cruise ship that was purpose-built for polar exploration. Built in Finland and launched in December 2021, SH *Minerva* features the most advanced green mechanical technologies and systems, and accommodates a maximum of 152 guests in spacious staterooms and suites. A team of expert expedition leaders and naturalists will plan and lead our activities ashore, while a fleet of Zodiac landing craft will bring us into intimate contact with the places we will explore.


THE NEW, 76-CABIN EXPEDITION CRUISE SHIP MINERVA

Built in Finland, and launched in December 2021, Swan Hellenic's *Minerva* is a new-generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 10,250 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 250 passengers, *Minerva* accommodates a maximum of 152 guests in 76 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Minerva has been designed to meet the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code for ships navigating in Polar regions. Its high PC5 Category A ice-strengthened hull, and other technical and mechanical features, allow the ship to cruise the world's remote regions in safety and utmost comfort. Technologically advanced hybrid engines and a system of powerful batteries make it possible for the ship to cruise in ecologically sensitive areas, leaving minimal footprint, while a computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 120

experienced European officers and international crew members, *Minerva* will carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections as well as other amenities. Of the ship's 76 staterooms, 60 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge that is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna that includes an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; a "mud room" with lockers for storing expedition gear; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis.

Friday, July 8, 2022

Depart home for Oslo, Norway.

Saturday, July 9

OSLO, Norway

Arrive in Oslo, Norway's elegant capital, and transfer to *Clarion Hotel The Hub* (or similar). Tour Oslo in the afternoon, including Frogner Park, which includes the famed Vigeland sculptures, the work of Norwegian sculptor Gustav Vigeland; and the Fram Museum, home to the ships of some of Norway's most notable explorers. Enjoy a welcome dinner.

OSLO/FLY TO TROMSØ

Transfer to the airport for the group flight to Tromsø. On arrival transfer to the port to board the SH *Minerva*. Cruise in the evening.

Monday, July 11

BEAR ISLAND

Arrive at Bear Island, a small, uninhabited island that is a nature reserve and a designated Important Bird Area that supports huge colonies of birds. Aboard Zodiacs, cruise along the island's cliffs to observe the bird life.

Tuesday, July 12–Monday, July 18

EXPLORING SVALBARD

Spend seven days exploring this incredible archipelago of the High Arctic, located some 600 miles south of the North Pole. In the spirit of an expedition voyage, the ship's schedule will be kept flexible to take advantage of the best opportunities that arise for landings ashore and for wildlife sightings. SH *Minerva's* ice-strengthened hull allows it to enter safely the icy waterways, bays, and fjords of the islands, while the fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing craft, will bring us close to the places we want to explore and spot the amazing wildlife of the islands that includes polar bears. Some of the places we expect to visit are Bellsund, a 16-mile-long sound surrounded by snow-capped peaks and glaciers, where the cliffs house thousands of birds and polar bears are frequent visitors; Monaco Glacier, one of the most stunning in the archipelago; Nordaustlandet, part of the Spitsbergen Northeast Reserve, where polar bears may be spotted in their denning area and reindeer roam the tundra; Wijdefjorden, the longest fjord in the archipelago (more than 80 miles long), part of the Inner Wijdefjorden National Park, created to protect the rich flora of the High Arctic; and the maze of glacier-lined waterways of Southwest Spitsbergen National Park.


TROMSØ/FLY TO OSLO/FLY HOME





Cancellations & Refunds: Cancellations must be received in writing by AIA Tours. All cancellations received 2 months (60 days) or more prior to departure are fully refunded. Cancellations received 59-31 days prior to departure are subject to a cancellation fee equal to 50% of the total program cost per person. Cancellations received 30 days or less prior to departure are subject to a penalty equal to 100% of the full fare.
