Paleophatologies

An intensive program deticated to the study of the human remains of the castle cemetery is starting in 2024. This is a two weeks program, divided in two parts:

1. The excavation of the graveyard:

During the first week the team will continue the excavations at Zorita castle, to fully understand the process of the excavation of a burrial and the importance of the information taken during the excavation process.

The complexity of this graveyard makes of Zorita Castle the perfect site to start or to gain experience with the archaeology of the death. Once the grave has been located, the strategy for its excavation will be determinated, in orther to obtain all the information from the bones and their position, at the same time, the alterations that the extraction process could cause to the human remains are minimized.

The most delicate moment when excavating a grave is the extraction of the skeleton. Care must be taken not to cause damage to the bones and they should be clasified for easy identification in the laboratory, packing and labelling them appropriately. The transportation of the human remains from

2. The study of the bones:

The second week will be dedicated to the study of the human remains discovered at Zorita Castle. After packaging, the bones will be transported to the laboratory where the inventory of each skeleton will be carried out as well as the the registration forms for each tomb.

For the photographic record of the human remains the reconstruction of the skeleton will be necessary. This process will allow to obtain a first evaluation of the body. Later, the bones will be studied in detail and marks and pathologies will be analyzed.
