Archaeological Institute of America lecturer and host Colleen Batey (Ph.D., U. of Durham) recently retired from the University of Glasgow, Scotland. She now holds honorary positions at the University of the Highlands and Islands; University of Durham; and Hunter College, New York. For the past 40 years Colleen has been involved in research on the Viking Age in Scotland, Scandinavia, and the North Atlantic, both as director of excavations and teacher. Since 2004, she has combined her research interests with expedition cruising – as expedition team member and as guest lecturer – travelling extensively


throughout the world of the Vikings from the Black Sea to Canada. This has included six prior AlA-sponsored cruises in the North Atlantic and the Baltic Sea. Colleen was the British coordinator of Viking loan material for the highly successful Smithsonian exhibition *Vikings: The North Atlantic Saga*, which toured widely in the U.S. starting in 2000 and attracted several million visitors throughout its run. More recently she was an academic advisor for a PBS/BBC program "Uncovering the Vikings," which aired in early 2016. Colleen has published extensively, both books and journal articles. She is now based in Orkney, and her 18th-century home has stunning views of Scapa Flow!

The Men of the North were cast as barbarians who plundered their way across the known world during the enigmatic Viking Age, which prevailed for almost 300 years between the 8th and 11th centuries. They sailed on dragonships from Norway to settle in Scotland around A.D. 800—in Jarlshof on the

Shetland Islands and in the Hebrides, where over one hundred villages are still known by their originally settled Norse names, solidifying the enduring historic link between Norway's Vikings and Scotland's clans. Some of Scotland's best-known clans—the Clan Donald and Clan MacLeod—came from Norse ancestry, influencing the distinct dialects still spoken today on the Orkney and Shetland Islands. The nuances and rich histories of these two complex and deeply intertwined cultures await your discovery across these verdant and storied lands.

Day by Day Itinerary

Depart home city Friday, June 9

Glasgow, Scotland/ Embark the ship Saturday, June 10

Arrive in Glasgow, where the indelible mark of Viking conquest still permeates the culture, and embark the five-star LE DUMONT-D'URVILLE. Depart Glasgow accompanied by traditional melodies from a Scottish bagpiper.

Fort William for the Scottish Highlands Sunday, June 11

In Glenfinnan, see the Glenfinnan Viaduct, immortalized by the Hogwarts Express in the Harry Potter film series, and the Glenfinnan Monument commemorating the Jacobite Highlanders that rallied against King George II. See Neptune's Staircase, the longest staircase lock in Britain and an incredible feat of engineering. Explore Glencoe, one of Scotland's most scenic landscapes. Attend the Captain's Welcome Reception on board the ship this evening.

Kyle of Lochalsh/ Isle of Skye Monday, June 12

Visit Eilean Donan Castle, one of the world's most recognized castles—located on a little island where three sea lochs meet in the midst of some of Scotland's most dramatic scenery. Travel through the beautiful Cullin Mountains to the Isle of Skye's scenic coastal capital of Portree.

Kirkwall, Orkney Islands, for Ring of Brodgar and Skara Brae Tuesday, June 13

This morning, the director and head archaeologist of the Ness of Brodgar site, Nick Card, will provide insight on this impressive ancient compound that lies outside of Kirkwall.


Visit the Neolithic Heartland of Orkney, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and view the ceremonial Stones of Stenness and the Ring of Brodgar henge. Continue to the early Orcadian settlement of Skara Brae, then visit St. Magnus Cathedral,

also known as the "Light of the North." Hear the iconic sounds of a Scottish bagpiper as you reboard the ship in Kirkwall. This evening, enjoy a storyteller's performance of traditional Scottish tales.

Lerwick, Shetland Islands, for Jarlshof Wednesday, June 14

Dock in Lerwick and transfer to the island's southernmost point. Visit the archaeological site of Jarlshof, pending UNESCO designation.

See the remains of more than 4,000 years of human history, including an Iron Age broch and wheelhouse; late Neolithic stone houses; a Bronze Age village; Norse longhouses; a medieval farmstead; and a 16th-century laird's house.





Cruising Sognefjord, Norway/ FLÅM RAILWAY Thursday, June 15

Cruise Sognefjord, passing traditional farmsteads and villages flanked by soaring mountains and glaciers.

This afternoon, board the FLÅM RAILWAY, one of the world's most scenic train journeys, traveling 13 miles through 20 tunnels to Myrdal's mountaintop station.

Watch as mountains and waterfalls—including the awe-inspiring Kjosfossen—unfold along this branch of the world-renowned Bergen Line alongside intriguing hamlets.

In Bergen, stroll the grounds of Troldhaugen, the summer home of famed Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg. Take a walking tour of the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Bryggen, Bergen's historic waterfront. Attend the Captain's Farewell Reception this evening.
