

Our on-tour visits to Oldupai Gorge and its on-site museum are enriched by our AIA lecturer/host, who has conducted extensive paleontological and archaeological fieldwork in Tanzania. His work includes analysis of the iconic fossils from Oldupai Gorge as well as research at the Engare Sero footprint site, where he was part of the team that announced the remarkable human footprints to the world in 2020. He will contribute firsthand insights throughout the tour.

Archaeological Institute of America Lecturer and Host



William Harcourt-Smith is a paleoanthropologist and naturalist based at the American Museum of Natural History and the City University of New York. Will is an expert on human evolution and an experienced African safari tour leader. He will lecture and lead

discussions on the importance of the fossil sites we visit (Oldupai Gorge and Engare Sero), the geology of the Great Rift Valley, the ecosystems of the Ngorongoro Crater and Serengeti plains and, lastly, the future of East African wildlife. Will has conducted paleontological and archaeological fieldwork across Africa, Eurasia, and North America for over 20 years, including projects in South Africa, Kenya, Israel, Sudan, and Tanzania. His work in Tanzania includes analysis of the iconic fossils from Oldupai (formerly Olduvai) Gorge and conducting fieldwork at the new human footprint site of Engare Sero, where he was part of the team that announced the footprints to the world in 2020.

Will was born in Great Britain and raised across Europe. He has extensively published his research in both scientific and popular formats, from the journal *Nature* to *Natural History Magazine*. His work has been highlighted in many popular formats, including *National Geographic*, the *New York Times*, and *NOVA*. Will regularly lectures to the public about human origins around the globe, and has helped curate numerous exhibits, including the current *Hall of Human Origins* at the world's largest natural history museum, the American Museum of Natural History, located in New York City. Will has led this very AIA Tour previously to excellent reviews.



Experience the Serengeti’s Great Migration, and view two significant human origin fossil sites plus magnificent savannah and volcanic landscapes, including Ngorongoro Crater. Stay at exclusive and luxurious tented camps, and travel in spacious, four-wheel drive safari vehicles.

Highlights are many:

- Leading our group of just 16 participants is paleoanthropologist & naturalist Dr. William Harcourt-Smith and expert driver/guides.
- Spend three days experiencing the spectacular “Great Migration,” when hundreds of thousands of wildebeest, along with tens of thousands of zebra, amass in the Lake Ndutu area of the southern Serengeti ecosystem.
- Spend three days exploring the Great Rift Valley and the remarkable Ngorongoro Crater, an extinct volcanic crater 10 to 12 miles in diameter that is teeming with African wildlife.
- Spend two days at Lake Natron, at the foot of Ol Doinyo Lengai, an active volcano, and visit the archaeological site of Engare Sero, where your AIA lecturer has worked for two seasons—it has the largest assemblage of fossil footprints on the African continent.
- Visit the famous Oldupai (Olduvai) Gorge and its museum with your expert AIA lecturer, learning about the important hominid fossils and tools found there.
- Stay for two days at the beginning, plus a day room at the end, at a luxurious resort and spa hotel in Arusha and visit Arusha National Park.
- Enjoy eight nights at luxurious tented lodges in ideal locations, offering the amenities of a well-appointed hotel with the adventure of being under canvas.
- Travel in Land Cruiser safari vehicles with extra sitting room and space to stand, look, and photograph out all sides of their large, pop-up roof hatches.

Saturday, January 2, 2027: Depart home

Depart home on flights to Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) in Arusha, Tanzania.

Sunday, January 3: Arrive Arusha, Tanzania

Upon arrival at Kilimanjaro International Airport, you are met and transferred to our hotel. Guests who arrive before 5pm will enjoy welcome cocktails with our AIA lecturer/host Will Harcourt-Smith. *Two nights at the [Arusha Serena Hotel](#).* (R)

Monday, January 4: Arusha National Park | Welcome dinner

This morning you may relax and enjoy the amenities of our resort, or board our spacious safari vehicles and discover Arusha National Park, located along the slopes of Mt. Meru (14,968 ft.) and, farther away, Mt. Kilimanjaro (19,341 ft.), the two highest peaks in Tanzania. Although small, this park boasts a wide variety of landscapes and wildlife such as giraffe, waterbuck, buffalo, warthog, and zebra. The series of seven shallow, alkaline lakes on the northeastern side attracts wading birds such as flamingo. Enjoy a picnic lunch within the park. Return to our hotel, freshen up, and gather for a welcome dinner hosted by our AIA lecturer. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, January 5: Lake Natron

Set out this morning on a westward drive through the Gregory Rift, an offshoot of Africa's Great Rift Valley, to the remote and lesser-visited Lake Natron Game Controlled Area. We check-in to our camp, which provides dramatic views of Ol Doinyo Lengai, a still-active volcano sacred to the Maasai, that is over 9,700 feet above sea level. Just north of the volcano is Lake Natron, a large, shallow, alkaline lake that is a favorite feeding and breeding spot for up to two million flamingoes—a spectacular site to behold. *Two nights at the [Africa Safari Lake Natron Lodge](#).* (B,L,D)

Wednesday, January 6: Engare Sero | Lake Natron

Today we visit the archaeological site of Engare Sero, which is the largest human fossil footprint site that has been discovered on the African continent. Estimated to have been made between about 6,000 and 19,000 years ago, it preserves more than 400 human footprints in an ancient volcanic mudflow that dried almost like concrete. [See the "Human Origins" side bar.] We will enjoy a lecture and discussion with our AIA lecturer,

The Great Migration

We have carefully timed our safari to witness the great migration of wildebeest and zebra on the southern plains of the Serengeti during the wildebeest calving season. This is a wildlife spectacle second to none, with 10,000-12,000 babies born each day during the three- to six-week period. Wildebeest need to calve on the southern plains because the type of grass that grows in this area is rich in calcium and magnesium, which are essential for good lactation. Also, the short grass provides them with better visibility of approaching predators. Opportunities for wildlife observation and photography, especially predator-prey interaction, are unparalleled.

who worked at Engare Sero for two seasons and has been part of the research project for 15 years. We also have time to relax and enjoy our safari camp, with views of the lake and the volcano. (B,L,D)

Thursday, January 7: The Great Rift Valley | Ngorongoro Conservation Area
Depart Lake Natron and drive south along the spine of the dramatic Great Rift Valley, viewing craters, wildlife, and Maasai pastoralists, who follow their traditional ways, living in remarkable harmony with their environment and its wildlife. Young warriors carry spears and color their long hair with red ochre; the women wear elaborate and beautiful beadwork. We will see their herds and villages throughout much of our safari. Arrive at our luxurious tented camp that has just 15 rooms, perched on the eastern rim of the Ngorongoro Crater, part of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The astounding Crater is the world's largest intact and unfilled volcanic caldera. Formed when a massive volcano erupted and collapsed on itself two to three million years ago, the Crater is approximately 10 to 12 miles in diameter and 2,000 feet deep, and is teeming with wildlife. We will enjoy dinner and discussions with our lecturer while overlooking the Crater. Our tented camp offers the amenities of a luxury hotel combined with the adventure of being under canvas on the rim of the Crater. *Three nights at the Lion's Paw Camp.* (B,L,D)

Friday & Saturday, January 8 & 9: Ngorongoro Crater
Enjoy two days exploring down in the Ngorongoro Crater in our safari vehicles viewing lion, elephant, buffalo, zebra, and a wide variety of other mammals, plus numerous exotic birds amidst lakes, lush forests, and savannah vegetation. The Crater is home to 26,000 big mammals and 500 species of birds. After picnic lunches within the Crater, we return to our tented camp to relax and enjoy discussions, cocktails, and delicious dinners. (B,L,D each day)

Sunday, January 10: Oldupai Gorge | Lake Ndutu
Today we drive west, stopping at the famous Oldupai (Olduvai) Gorge, a remarkable archaeological site where, within the sides of the gorge, is a rich chronicle of human ancestry and the evolution of the Serengeti ecosystem. Learn about the important fossils and tools discovered at this site with our expert AIA lecturer as we visit the Gorge and its excellent site museum. [See the "Human Origins" side bar.] We continue driving west to Lake Ndutu, on the southern edge of the Serengeti, another UNESCO World Heritage Site, and check-in to our luxurious safari camp. *Three nights at Lake Ndutu Luxury Tented Lodge.* (B,L,D)

Monday & Tuesday, January 11 & 12: Lake Ndutu & Serengeti National Park | Farewell dinner
Lake Ndutu is located adjacent to the southeastern section of the immense Serengeti National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The world-famous herds of the "Great Migration" follow a seasonal route, and we have timed our visit to witness vast numbers of wildebeest and zebra on the southern plains. Wildebeest calving season is a wildlife spectacle second to none. [See the "Great Migration" side bar.] We enjoy two full days of morning and afternoon game drives in our four-seater safari vehicles, traversing the savannah. Enjoy a farewell dinner on January 12th. An optional, early morning balloon ride over the savannah is available at additional cost. (B,L,D each day)

Wednesday, January 13: Bush flight to Arusha | Fly home OR begin optional Zanzibar extension
After our last morning game drive, we drive to the Ndutu airstrip (just 15 minutes away from our tented camp) for a one-hour bush flight to Arusha, arriving in the early afternoon. Those who are on the optional Zanzibar extension will connect to a flight to Zanzibar. Everyone else will transfer to our hotel, where day rooms and lunch have been arranged. Relax in the gardens or explore Arusha independently. This evening, transfer to Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) for independent flights homeward (your international flight departure must be after 5pm). *Day room at the Arusha Serena Hotel.* (B,L)


Human Origins

Explore two immensely important archaeological sites with your expert paleoanthropologist, Will Harcourt-Smith.

Learn why **Oldupai (Olduvai) Gorge**, often referred to as the "Cradle of Mankind," is one of the most significant paleoanthropological sites in the world, shaping our understanding of human evolution and early human life with the discovery of primitive hand axes, hominid skull fragments, and evidence of multiple hominin species. The site continues to be essential for research to this day.

The other site you will visit, **Engare Sero**, is one at which your AIA lecturer spent two seasons and has been part of the research project for 15 years. Engare Sero—initially discovered by local Maasai community members—is a site of exceptional archaeological importance, preserving over 400 human footprints, the largest collection of ancient human footprints currently known in Africa. The footprints are

remarkably well-preserved and are dated to between approximately 5,760 and 19,100 years ago. The site also preserves footprints of animals such as zebra and buffalo, offering insights into environmental context.



Found in 1959 by Mary Leakey, Olduvai Hominid 5 (OH 5) was one of the first major hominin discoveries at Oldupai and played a key role in demonstrating Africa as the center of early human evolution. OH 5 is the famous "Nutcracker Man" skull, the holotype of the species *Paranthropus boisei* (originally named *Zinjanthropus boisei*) dated about 1.75–1.8 million years old (Bed I deposits).



WHAT TO EXPECT



LIGHT: This tour requires a basic level of fitness.

You must be in good physical condition to participate on this safari and able to walk, unassisted, over uneven terrain and up and down steps. Participants who are not able to sit comfortably, and walk and stand unassisted, for extended periods are kindly advised not to join this tour. Hotels, lodges, and camps have been chosen for their excellent locations and generous comfort. The tented camps have spacious sleeping quarters, flush toilets, hot and cold running water, and 24-hour electricity.

The international flights are long, and we will spend many hours in four-wheel-drive vehicles on game drives. Land travel, especially on game drives, will be over very bumpy roads. Participants with back issues should consult with their physician and consider traveling with appropriate back support. There may be considerable dust in the air during game drives. Participants with allergies or breathing issues are encouraged to travel with a dust mask or bandana to inhibit dust inhalation. If you have any questions about your ability to participate, we suggest that you visit your personal physician with this brochure in hand and discuss whether or not this program is appropriate for you. All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by Sponsors/Operator, local staff, and host country laws. Any participant showing signs of illness will be asked to wear a mask when in close proximity to others. If the tour manager decides that a participant cannot participate in a game drive or visit a site safely or in a timely manner, their judgment will be final. All participants are expected to enjoy traveling as part of a group, and to be ready to experience cultural differences.

Although as a trip participant you are a member of the AMREF Flying Doctors, which provides travelers with emergency medical evacuation to the nearest hospital, you should also be aware that medical services or facilities may not be readily available during your trip. Each participant must be covered by medical insurance that is valid overseas. Generally, the weather will be pleasant with clear skies, and daytime temperatures will range from the mid-70s F to the mid-80s F, while overnight temperatures may fall to the mid- to high 50s F. Equatorial sun is very intense and we recommend protective hats and clothing, using strong sunblock, and drinking plenty of water. Included meals will be of a high quality. Beer, wine, and cocktails at camps and lodges will be available for direct purchase, when not included with meals. Toilet facilities will be primitive during game drives. The maximum altitude on this trip is just under 8,000 feet above sea level. Participants on the extension will be expected to pay a mandatory infrastructure tax upon checking in to the resort of \$10 per day, per person, and purchase a mandatory insurance policy issued by the Government of Zanzibar. January 13-16, 2027 (4 days)

On January 13th, you will take a group flight to Zanzibar, where you will relax and enjoy the luxurious facilities of [Bluebay Beach Resort & Spa](#), situated on the finest white, sandy beach on Zanzibar’s east coast. Enjoy three nights at this resort, set amid 30 acres of tropical gardens with over 1,000 palm trees; fine food and wine highlighting local ingredients; and access to sports and leisure facilities and the Oasis Spa (at additional cost).

Included in your program is a guided, half-day tour of Stone Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Learn about the events that shaped the deep history and culture of Zanzibar while exploring the former Slave Market, Anglican Cathedral, Old Arab Fort, and Old Dispensary. While tracing the steps of the past in Stone Town, you also have a window into modern life. Explore the markets, with seafood and fish piled high in the fish market, fresh bread in wicker baskets, and neat stacks of fruits and vegetables as traders sell their wares from their stalls.





Luxury Tented Camps

Our tented camps provide an authentic, immersive, and personalized experience, with fewer guests. Feel closer to nature without sacrificing comfort. Enjoy the nighttime sounds of the animals, and experience wildlife that may walk through camp. These are permanent tented camps on stable platforms with tile or wooden flooring. They have spacious sleeping quarters, ensuite bathrooms with flush toilets, hot and cold running water, and 24-hour electricity. Our camps are chosen both for their generous comfort and excellent locations. When we are at the *Lake Nduvu Luxury Tented Lodge*, we are near the huge wildebeest migration. And, *Lion's Paw Camp* provides quick access to the floor of the Ngorongoro Crater—just a 10-minute drive to the Crater entrance.

Spacious 4x4 Safari Vehicles

Travel in six-seater, stretch safari vehicles, with the middle row of seats removed so just four passengers may enjoy extra leg room, space for gear, and more freedom to move about when standing for unrestricted wildlife viewing from the large pop-up roofs. We spend a lot of time in these vehicles, and you will appreciate this extra space when you see other groups with six or even more passengers cramped in the same size vehicles. Each vehicle carries potable water for refilling your own water bottle as needed. Your expert driver/guide will spot and identify wildlife, and your AIA lecturer will rotate from vehicle to vehicle.

Flights & Transfers

Airfare from/to home is not included. Individual and/or group (depending on flight schedules) airport transfers on arrival at and departure from Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) (or Arusha Regional Airport [ARK] to continue on to the post-tour extension) are included on program dates. An in-program group bush flight from the Nduvu airstrip to Arusha on the main tour will be booked for you and is included in the tour price (subject to change until ticketed). The in-program group flight to Zanzibar, for extension participants, will be booked for you and is included in the extension price (subject to change). A departure transfer to Abeid Amani Karume International Airport (ZNZ) for extension participants is also included.

Once you have received your final payment invoice, you should book your flights from/to home. If you are considering booking your flights before this time, please contact AIA Tours first.
