Arrive early at the sacred island of **Delos**, mythological birthplace of Apollo and Artemis, to enjoy peaceful exploration of its remarkably preserved ruins. Cruise to nearby **Mykonos**, for an opportunity to swim in its azure waters and wander its charming cobblestone streets. Continue on to Türkiye, to walk the marble-lined avenues of ancient **Ephesus**, and experience the lively streets of **Kuşadası**. Return to Greece to explore the partially reconstructed Bronze Age palace of **Knossos** on Crete, before disembarking in Athens.

You may choose to continue your adventure with a **three-night extension** to the storied Peloponnese peninsula. From your seaside base in **Nafplion**, explore ancient **Corinth**, the Bronze Age citadel of **Mycenae**, and the well-preserved theater at **Epidaurus**, before concluding with a final evening in Athens.

AIA STUDY LEADERS (Cruise only: Sept. 26-30)

Since 1993, **JACK DAVIS** has held the endowed post of Carl Blegen Professor of Greek Archaeology at the University of Cincinnati and, since 2015, he has co-directed the team that discovered the spectacular grave of the Griffin Warrior and two Mycenaean beehive tombs at the Palace of Nestor at Pylos. Davis has authored or edited a dozen books and has written or co-authored some 120 articles in scholarly journals. For his work he has been honored by the German and Finnish archaeological institutes in Greece, and by the Archaeological Society of Athens. He is an honorary citizen of Pylos, and has

been medaled by both the presidents of Greece and Albania. He is a fellow of the Society of Antiquaries of London and a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He has received the Archaeological Institute of America's Gold Medal for lifetime achievement. Davis is a former director of the American School of Classical Studies at Athens (ASCSA). He is at present a Trustee of that institution as well as an Overseer of its Gennadius Library. Most recently the Trustees of the

ASCSA have awarded him its

prestigious Athens Prize.

SHARON R. STOCKER has worked on archaeological projects in the U.S. and Greece and, since 1996, has been directing archaeological excavations at Pylos and in Albania. Since 2011 she has lived year-round in Pylos, where she is an honorary citizen, initially to direct a U. of Cincinnati team collaborating with the Greek Ministry of Culture in improving touristic facilities at the Palace of Nestor. That collaboration resulted in the construction of the magnificent shelter that today protects the Mycenaean palace's remains. Stocker co-directed the team that discovered the unparalleled grave of the Griffin Warrior in 2015 and two previously unknown Mycenaean beehive tombs in

2018. She continues to supervise that work on a year-round basis. Stocker coordinated efforts that brought exhibits of finds from these excavations to the Museum of Messenia, the J. Paul Getty Villa, and the National Museum of Athens in 2025-26. She has been honored for her work by the president of Greece, who appointed her a commander in the Order of the Phoenix, and by the Giuseppe Sciacca Foundation of Vatican City. She is a fellow of the Society of Antiquaries of London and served for several years as President of the Archaeological Institute of America's Cincinnati society.

TUESDAY & WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22 & 23

HOME ≈ ATHENS, GREECE

Depart home on overnight flights to Athens. Upon arrival, transfer to the *Grand Bretagne*, a 5-star deluxe hotel in the refined Kolonaki district, just steps from Syntagma Square. Gather with fellow travelers for a welcome reception and dinner at the hotel. *GRANDE BRETAGNE* (R,D)

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 24 ATHENS

Begin the day with a lecture to set the stage for your exploration of ancient Greece, and set out to explore Plaka (Athens' oldest neighborhood) and the ancient Agora, once the bustling heart of civic life in classical Athens. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. In the afternoon, visit the Museum of Cycladic Art, a remarkable repository of ancient Aegean treasures, or the Byzantine & Christian Museum, which houses some of the most important collections of Byzantine icons, mosaics, and religious artifacts in the world. Dinner is on your own this evening, with many excellent restaurants just steps from the hotel. *GRANDE BRETAGNE* (B,L)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 25

ATHENS ≈ DELPHI

Travel to Delphi for a full-day excursion to one of the most important sacred sites of the ancient Greek world. Explore the Sanctuary of Apollo, the Temple of Athena Pronaia, and the site's theater, then tour the nearby museum, home to the renowned bronze Charioteer and other masterpieces. Return to Athens in the late afternoon. Dinner is on your own this evening. GRANDE BRETAGNE (B,L)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26


ATHENS ≈ EMBARKATION


Visit the Acropolis to admire the iconic Parthenon, followed by a visit to the outstanding Acropolis Museum. After an authentic Greek lunch, continue to Piraeus to embark the *Emerald Azzurra*. SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 27

DELOS ≈ MYKONOS

After a morning lecture, step ashore on the sacred island of Delos, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and mythological birthplace of twin gods Apollo and Artemis. A guided tour reveals the island's remarkably preserved temples, homes, and mosaics, offering a vivid picture of life in a once-thriving religious and commercial hub. Enjoy lunch as you cruise to nearby Mykonos. There's time to swim, relax or explore onshore. *EMERALD AZZURRA* (B,L,D)





MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 28 KUŞADASI, TÜRKIYE

Arrive in Kuşadası and set out for a guided exploration of Ephesus, one of the most spectacular archaeological sites in the eastern Mediterranean. Walk the marble-paved streets of this ancient Greco-Roman city, passing temples, baths, and homes, and visit the impressive Library of Celsus and the Great Theater. In the afternoon, choose between visiting the Ephesus Museum, showcasing stunning artifacts from the nearby ruins, or enjoying free time in Kuşadası. Return to the ship for dinner on board and an evening sail toward Crete. *EMERALD AZZURRA* (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29 HERAKLION, CRETE, GREECE

Spend the morning exploring the ruins of Knossos, the center of the Bronze Age Minoan civilization and legendary home of the labyrinth and the Minotaur. Then visit the Heraklion Archaeological Museum, which houses a superb collection of Minoan art. Celebrate the journey with a farewell reception and dinner on board. *EMERALD AZZURRA* (B,L,R,D)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30 ATHENS \approx HOME

Disembark in Athens this morning and transfer to Athens International Airport for flights home. Travelers joining the optional post-tour extension to the Peloponnese peninsula will continue on by motorcoach. (B)

OPTIONAL POST-TOUR EXTENSION: Peloponnese Discovery

Continue your journey with three nights in Greece's Peloponnese, a region where layers of history unfold amid striking landscapes. Explore the ruins of Corinth, stand before the legendary citadel of Mycenae, and marvel at the ancient theater of Epidaurus, celebrated for its remarkable acoustics. Balance these encounters with time to unwind in the seaside beauty of Nafplion. Conclude your travels in Athens with a visit to the National Archaeological Museum, home to one of the world's most important collections of ancient art.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 30CORINTH & NEMEA ≈ NAFPLION

Disembark in Piraeus and travel into the Peloponnese, stopping to explore ancient Corinth and the archaeological site of Nemea before continuing to the port town of Nafplion. Along the way, pause for a leisurely lunch featuring fresh local specialties. In the evening, enjoy time at leisure to experience Nafplion by night, whether strolling through its lamplit squares, dining at a seaside restaurant, or simply soaking in the romantic atmosphere of Greece's first capital. *AMPHITRYON HOTEL* (B with main program, L)

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 1 MYCENAE & EPIDAURUS ≈ NAFPLION

Discover the Lion Gate and the monumental beehive tombs of Mycenae, once the seat of Agamemnon and central to Homeric legend. Continue on to Epidaurus to experience the extraordinary acoustics of its 4th-century B.C. theater. Pause midday for lunch and a wine tasting at a local estate, where native grape varieties and time-honored traditions highlight the distinct character of Greek wines. Return to Nafplion in the evening and enjoy free time for dinner at one of its inviting seaside tavernas. AMPHITRYON HOTEL (B,L)

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 2 ATHENS

Return to Athens and check in to the *Xenodocheio Milos Hotel*, set overlooking Old Parliament Square and within walking distance of the National Gardens. Enjoy free time with lunch at leisure before an optional guided visit to the National Archaeological Museum, which houses masterpieces including the celebrated gold artifacts of Mycenae. Conclude your travels with a festive farewell dinner. *XENODOCHEIO MILOS* (B,D)

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 3 ATHENS \approx HOME

Transfer to Athens International Airport for flights home. (B)



WHAT TO EXPECT Daily activities can involve up to two miles of walking, and many walking tours will take place in older quarters and historic sites, where the terrain is often cobblestone or uneven. Many historic buildings do not have elevators and you'll encounter steps without handrails. While the ship has elevators that connect all passenger decks, participants should be capable of navigating stairs in rolling seas. Some shore excursions may require boarding a tender to go ashore. Staff and crew will be available to assist as needed.

GROUP SIZE This program is limited to 84 participants, including travelers from the Archaeological Institute of America, Princeton Journeys, Harvard Alumni Travels, and Princeton Theological Seminary.

TRAVEL INSURANCE Travel insurance for trip cancellation and interruption, medical problems, baggage loss and delay, etc., is highly recommended. Trip cancellation policies that apply to this travel program are included in this brochure. Information about travel insurance will be sent to confirmed participants.
